The **9**<sup>th</sup> **annual** AfrikaBurn event, this year themed **The Gift**, took place from the 27th April to 3rd May. The annual transformation of the Tankwa landscape in the Northern Cape, into a temporary town is run predominantly on a diet of public art projects and created by the citizens of what is known as Tankwa Town. Projects ranged from large scale sculptural works to dance processions and street theatre to small scale interactive pieces and kids' art involving hundreds of artists with thousands collaborators in a massive outpouring of uninhibited creative expression. Tankwa Town reached the **10 000 population** mark this year, over the **7 days**.

**33 visual and performance art projects** received a Creative Grant from AfrikaBurn, including four major projects supported with a R1 million grant from the Department of Arts and Culture. The assistance lent to the projects by additional funding from the Department of Arts and Culture provided greater ability for the arts projects to foster more creative collaborations. The financial support increased the reach of the works as well deepening community involvement in and beyond the annual event. A large international gaze is on the annual burn activities and the support by our national Government was well-received information by participants and especially peer artists.

Artists were able to apply for a creative grant – performance or artwork up until 31 December 2014. Applicants submitted a project registration form and creative grant application form to the Art Committee, who assessed the projects, scoring against six criteria including wider social contribution. Art applicants were scored first on individual merit and then against the other applications. Shortlisted applicants were then considered from a curatorial perspective. All applicants were responded to with feedback and successful applicants were contracted.

In addition to the registered works **9 new artworks** were registered onsite at Arteria, with **3 additional burns.** Open Mic sessions were scheduled in the Off Centre Camp.

**100 art cars** were registered with the Department of Mutant Vehicles. Registration for a mobile artwork involved completion a registration form along with a sketch and written description of the mutation of the vehicle to the Department of Mutant Vehicles before the event

**10 grants** were allocated to vehicles. All mutant vehicles were tested on arrival against safety standards and acceptably of modification as a mobile artwork, before licensing. Many incorporated sound systems and DJs. These were:

Participants created other unregistered theme camps on site, wherever they were camped in Tankwa Town.

Approximately 1400 volunteers filled the **1784 volunteer slots** throughout the event in a variety of capacities. The majority, 957, signed up ahead of the event. Most volunteers offer more than one shift at the event. The biggest contingency is the Rangers at 642 slots, followed by the gate team of 174 slots. Many of the opportunities are skilled and volunteers receive training. The full compliment of support includes:

This does not include the volunteers producing the artworks, building and rigging on site or the Department of Public Works (right) building and striking Tankwa Town over a period of **45 days**. The DPW crew is a **minimum of 25** for the duration, reaching a **peak participation of 65**.

Taking learning from the harsh environment of the desert into urban settings encourages a new way of being and working. Increasing access to public art through this endeavor stimulates audience participation, consumption and demand for new works.
