


PLEASE SELECT THE YEARS YOU HAVE ATTENDED AFRIKABURN?














WHAT AGE GROUP ARE YOU IN?



Heard tickets were on sale and immediately googled Afrikaburn tickets. As I purchased my ticket I read the Afrikaburn notice only to ever use Quicket. Thank goodness I got my ticket back but really struggled to obtain a ticket this year although being my eighth burn. They were all sold out in one day ... Almost got a heart attack ...


I battled to buy the tickets on Quicket as the site kept crashing so in desperation I bought on Viagogo which was super easy and efficient. I found out after about a week that it was a scam and started to see how I could retrieve my money. Fortunately for me I have a friend high up in ABSA which is my bank and he was able to get his Fraudulent department onto the case and after much backwards and forwards I was able to get a full refund by ABSA. I did lay a complaint to ABSA which they noted and also complained to Viagogo but they keep using the clause that they are just a platform to connect the buyers and sellers so they are not responsible for any direct tickets sales. I would definitely HIGHLIGHT that VIAGOGO are a scam site on all AFRIKABURN sites as I had heard a lot of people got scammed like I did.

The awesome people that run arteria and the amazing spot on the binnekring - getting to meet all the artists





Supposedly love, showers, cooked food, shelter, music etc.. But almost none existent. Super badly run.

Tent, shower, kitchen facilities, charging ports

Kitchen, shower, toilet, beer

Tent, all bedding, water, showers, common area, fire, refrigerators, joy!

PLUG AND PLAY?

Food, community, love, playing music

It was ridiculous tbh. But in the end we've got 1 litre of water a day, showers and a shaded tent to put our tents under it.





TALK TO US ABOUT PLUG AND PLAY

I did not see any, but hear some rumors about a Plug & Play camp in the free zone. Also somebody told me that somebody told them that they stayed at but did not have to do anything appart from paying. (So this might be incorrect). Also, some company in cape town advertised a Plug and Play camp on Insta.

Didn't notice any

Few friends told us they are working in plug and play camps. Had a few shifts making food, doing dishes ect. My feeling is that you should "free yourself" from the outside world not pay people to again work for you and have your luxuries

Yes, saw evidence of them.

Ours was all about contribution of work and effort as well as pooled funds to get stuff done. Everyone did work and build shifts and contributed.

We had solar panels so no problem

Yes – it's sometimes a struggle to make the budget for the camp with the South African members so it seems that camps get more first time Europeans who can help carry the financial costs, but then they come into the week with expectations of what's owed to them for their financial contributions

Was not aware of any.

I saw a few theme camps that seemed pretty plug-and-play(ish). was one of them that shocked me the most. The camp fees were out of this world (50k per couple) and the setup with unreal. They had a mobile bathroom and a whole dining room (which looked beautiful though). I do know someone that camped there and they didn't have to bring any gear. (or however it's called) Camp Fees: 1500 euros They also didn't need to bring anything. This information is from discussions with some of the camp members, so cannot 100% verify this information.

THE SAD TRUTH ABOUT PLUG AND PLAY

Wow. I heard of one camp. or something? Apparently it looked like a refugee situation. So much so that we took one of their members in. It sounded like a shitshow and I feel sorry for the poor participants who arrived to discover they had been taken advantage of and were out on their own.

Yep, but they are a necessary evil, especially for the hard core international party crowd, and we need them to subsidise the rest of us poor mortals. Good that you have a non-plug-and-play mentality in place, but don't get to hung up about it: you will never be able to stamp it out 100%, and it does have a positive benefit. I was more pissed off by the blatant littering and disregard for the founding principles as regards the toilets (fucking 2 ply) and littering (moop everywhere) than I was by plug and play






It was co-designed by some long standing Burners of colour who access the event through the Anathi programme (radically discounted tickets and access grants), with support from the Org team.


NOT JUST TERRIBLE MUSIC

TELL US MORE ABOUT NOISE LEVELS:

I do love the music, but I do prefer to have a break at some point, so not 24/7.

For the first time ever I had a panic attack related to the music. I camp next to sound camps and it's okay over all. The biggest problem was when the base would vibrate the floor and buzz for longer and longer. Maybe the could lift the sound rigs to not do that? I went to sanctuary but it was also surrounded by sound camps. Is there any way to have sanctuary more quiet?

One or two stray camps playing music and keeping us up at night were annoying

It was generally good, the quiet hours were good for a lot of people. However roaming around vehicles often stopped where they really shouldn't, by non-theme camps and even outside of medic and sanctuary.

Sound level was great this year compared to other years! Lots of doef doef on the playa, but in the quite zone we could actually sleep and our tents didn't vibrate.


