ABOUT AFRIKABURN

AfrikaBurn is a creative art movement that has been around since 2007. It was originally called Afrika Burns but was renamed by the public in 2008. AfrikaBurn is part of the Burning Man regional network. This means that all around the world there are initiatives that bring local burners together. It is an amazing place where people can come together and be creative. Through participation we build relationships. Whether you want to create art, a performance, music, costumes, a theme camp, a mutant vehicle, volunteer services or anything else, this is the place to be. It takes place around the end of April every year but there are also other related initiatives taking place throughout the entire year. Volunteering at AfrikaBurn is not limited to the event, we need help the entire year-round! As our mission statement says: AfrikaBurn is a participant-created movement, an experiment in inclusive community building, decommodification, creativity, self-reliance, and radical selfexpression. Who is AfrikaBurn?



II GUIDING PRINCIPLES

AfrikaBurn follows 11 guiding principles which are considered guidelines. They are not rules that every participant needs to follow it is just a way to reinvent the world anew as a community.

1. Radical Inclusion

Everyone should be able to be a part of AfrikaBurn. As an intentional community, committed to inventing the world anew, we actively pursue mechanisms to address imbalances and overcome barriers to participation, especially in light of past, current and systemic injustice. We welcome and respect the stranger. Anyone can belong

2. Gifting

We are devoted to acts of gift giving. The value of a gift is unconditional. Gifting does not contemplate a return or an exchange for something of equal value.

3. Decommodification

In order to preserve the spirit of gifting, our community seeks to create social environments that are unmediated by commercial sponsorships, transactions, or advertising. We stand ready to protect our culture from such exploitation. We resist the substitution of consumption for participatory experience.

4. Radical Self-Reliance

AfrikaBurn encourages the individual to discover, exercise and rely on his or her inner resources.

5. Radical Self-Expression

Radical self-expression arises from the unique gifts of the individual. No one other than the individual or a collaborating group can determine its content. It is offered as a gift to others. In this spirit, the giver should respect the rights and liberties of the recipient.

6. Communal Effort

Our community values creative cooperation and collaboration. We strive to produce, promote and protect social networks, public spaces, works of art, and methods of communication that support such interaction.

7. Civic Responsibility

We value civil society. Community members who organise events should assume responsibility for public welfare and endeavor to communicate civic responsibilities to participants. They must also assume responsibility for conducting events in accordance with national and local laws.

8. Leaving No Trace

Our community respects the environment. We are committed to leaving no physical trace of our activities wherever we gather. We clean up after ourselves and endeavor, whenever possible, to leave such places in a better state than when we found them.

9. Participation

Our community is committed to a radically participatory ethic. We believe that transformative change, whether in the individual or in society, can occur only through the medium of deeply personal participation. We achieve being through doing. Everyone is invited to work. Everyone is invited to play. We make the world real through actions that open the heart.

10. Immediacy

Immediate experience is, in many ways, the most important value in our culture. We seek to overcome barriers that stand between us and a recognition of our inner selves, the reality of those around us, participation in society, and contact with a natural world exceeding human powers. No idea can substitute for this experience.

11. Each One Teach One

As a self-reliant community, we believe the responsibility of spreading our culture lies with each and every one of us. All of us are custodians of our culture – when the opportunity presents itself, we pass knowledge on.

MOOP

MOOP stands for Matter Out Of Place. This is used when referring to any matter that should not be where it was found. During the event, it is extremely important to leave the desert behind as we found it which is why the principle Leave No Trace is important.

Top 5 MOOP tips:

- 1.Bring back everything you brought with you. Aim to bring back more items than you originally brought. Absolutely everything that came with you must leave with you.
- 2. When you're dancing, going to a Burn event, chilling at a Theme Camp, or taking an Artwalk, remember to pick up your trash as you go. Burners live by the guiding principle of Leave No Trace.
- 3. Cigarette butts are the most significant form of MOOP, so bring along a portable ashtray for them.
- 4. Be mindful of the weight and size of what you bring. Pack and re-pack your items, removing any unnecessary packaging, and avoiding items like sequins, glitter, and feathers.
- 5. Use a bucket with a lid for organic waste when camping. Ideally purchase items without initial packaging. Use ecofriendly toiletries like soap and toothpaste spit your toothpaste into a bottle.

^{*}Bonus tip: Leave No Trace means leaving the desert as you found it. Ground campfires are not allowed. It's a nature reserve and we would like to ask that you please clean up your ash and coals, as well as put the rocks back where you found them. Bring your fire pit and take it home with you!

WHAT TO BRING AND WHAT NOT

Certainly! Here's a "What to Bring" and "What Not to Bring" list to help you prepare for AfrikaBurn:

What to Bring:

- Ticket & ID: You'll be asked to go home without it
- Vehicle Pass: One per vehicle. Motorcycles need one too.
- Water: A minimum of 5 liters of water per person per day for hydration.
- Food & Drinks: Refer to the Top 5 Moop Tips
- **Shelter:** Tent, camper, or other suitable shelter for your accommodation. Prepare to put rebar in bedrock!
- Bedding: Sleeping gear to stay comfortable.
- Clothing: Both warm and cool clothing.
- Trash Bags: please recycle and take your trash home
- Fire Extinguisher: Essential for fire safety.
- Medical Kit: Basic first-aid supplies.
- Prescriptions: Any necessary medications.
- **Lighting:** Various light sources (headlamp, torch, bike light, fairy lights, EL wire) and spare batteries.
- Duct Tape & Cable Ties: Versatile tools for various purposes.
- Wood & Brazier: If you're bringing wood, have a brazier or braai for fires. Ground campfires are not allowed.

What NOT to Bring:

- Flares: Flares are dangerous and not allowed due to fire hazards.
- Fireworks: Fireworks can pose a significant fire risk and are prohibited.
- Fire Lanterns: The use of fire lanterns is not permitted for safety reasons.
- **Feathers:** Avoid bringing feathers, as they can be harmful to the environment and wildlife.
- **Glitter:** Even biodegradable glitter is discouraged, as it's challenging to distinguish from regular glitter and creates cleanup issues.
- Firearms: Firearms are strictly prohibited at the event.
- A KAK Vibe: Don't be kak be lekker #play responsibly
- A Drone: NO DRONES ALLOWED AT AFRIKABURN

VOLUNTEER POSITIONS

RANGERS

At the event

The Tankwa Town Rangers are volunteers at AfrikaBurn who dedicate their time to ensure the safety and well-being of the community. They are known as "The Orange" and serve as nonconfrontational mediators, sources of information, and promoters of AfrikaBurn's guiding principles. Rangers patrol Tankwa Town day and night, assisting with various situations such as directing people, finding lost children, managing burn perimeters, and supporting overwhelmed participants. They are distinct from the event's security team, whose primary role is gate security. The Rangers work on the principles of Radical Self Reliance and Participation and Civil Responsibility, encouraging individual responsibility and proactive risk management. To become a Ranger, individuals attend a five-hour training session and commit to at least one event shift, with more experience allowing for greater contributions to the community.

Dust Rangers

Dust Rangers form the core of all Ranger services. These Rangers walk around, talk to people, visit, interact with AfrikaBurn and all its art, advocate for our 11 Guiding Principles, and apply them with compassion where and if needed. These Rangers are the eyes and ears for the whole Ranger crew. They know much about Tankwa Town because they see it all first!

SANCTUARY

At the event

Sanctuary is a calm, safe place for those facing challenges at our events, particularly in harsh desert conditions. Extreme factors like wind, dust, noise, temperatures, intense partying, and camping stress can be overwhelming. Practicing radical self-reliance means seeking help from campmates, neighbours, and friends, and proactively preventing issues. Sanctuary, a joint effort by the organizers and the community, provides support in Tankwa Town. It's a safe space at Off Centre Camp, offering peer support, well-being assistance, rest, refreshments, and collaboration with the operations team to prevent future challenges.

Volunteer roles:

CuddleFish

CuddleFish volunteers provide supervision to the on-duty Sanctuary volunteers, and there is a CuddleFish on duty 24/7 through the burn, to help with any team challenges or to be extra hands if things get super busy. This role is filled by dedicated core team members with professional mental health expertise.

Harbourmaster

Shift Leaders who have experience as Tangles (Sitters) and are there to be keeping it all going smoothly in Sanctuary. They manage the shift and allocation of guests to sitters in the space. They are supported by CuddleFish, and are in turn, supporting the sitters, guests and other volunteers in the space. This role is filled by experienced Sanctuary sitters who have been invited and trained up (similar to the ranger Tortoise), specifically. You will receive an additional invitation, when you have been approved for this role.

Tangle

If you sign up to be a sitter who directly provides peer support to guests who are having a challenging experience, then this is you. Your official job title is "Tangle". We have Tangles on each shift and prefer a mix of genders and age to ensure comfortable allocation as guests may require.





Space-keeper

Provides background help, feng shui magic and general Zen Mastery. The Space Keeper helps with keeping volunteers and Guests supplied with practical support- blankets, refreshments and temperature control and keeping the interior beauootiful and calm. A great role for those who are maybe new to Sanctuary, and would like a little more experience of the space before offering to sit (Tangle) guests. This role provides a fabulous service for the whole team through keeping the space organised, tidy and calm.

Door-keeper

The Door- keepers assist our Harbour Masters with guest arrivals, as well as keeping the boundary of our space intact from noise, visitors or other possible interruptions to the serenity of Sanctuary. This can be a good role for new volunteers or if one-to- one peer support isn't your vibe, but you still want to support Sanctuary. Door- keepers greet and support people who are coming into the space, help the friends and family of guests, and help keep the space Zen-ful and not over-full of people or noise. Often this involves keeping the literal home fire burning at our outdoor chill space and being a first-person smiling face when Tankwa's guests arrive at Sanctuary.

DIE HEK

At the event

After navigating the long stofstreep (dirt road) that is the R355 everyone gets to stop and stretch before they go through the portal from the default world into the real world. This is when they meet Die Hek Force (The AfrikaBurn Gate crew).

As a Hek Force volunteer, you are not a welcome fairy, but rather you are the very first touchpoint for folks arriving at the event. You will conduct the checks that need to happen to ensure a smooth process for burners in the queue (Do you have your ticket? Do you have your ID?). Die Hek is also a checkpoint for any stowaways and future potential MOOP disasters in each vehicle (plants, pets and feathers are all a no).

Die Hek Force is key to engaging with people before they enter Tankwa Town as a way to orientate participants as to what to expect and what the Burn is about. It's also a golden moment to truly embody the Each One Teach One principle, especially for Virgin Burners around the Principles.

Often times you will need to do some traffic control and provide a LOT of guidance ("Do you know how to use the toilets properly?") but best believe, the energy is electric, joyful and SO much fun.

CIA

(COMMUNICATIONS INFRASTRUCTURE AND ANALYTICS)

The CIA (Communications Infrastructure and Analytics) is an elite team of technologists that manage the data, communications technology and digital security of the organisation and community. We play with cool toys to save lives, and we're also the reason you can register projects, call home, get contracts, apply for grants, apply for shifts, etc. We don't do on-site signups, nor do we have sign-up or shift lists at the event. In fact, we hope we're not working too hard - because all the work gets done year-round. We're looking for people to step up and join us for the journey, not the destination.

Volunteer positions:

YEAR ROUND Secret Agents

Are you into secret projects with weird results? The CIA is always looking for platform-agnostic. project-based volunteers that take on cool projects and realise them in a multidisciplinary way. Projects like the AfrikaBurn App, or car counting software for the event gate, or developing a non-lithium power store, or an on-site server cluster. If someone can dream it, we can do it. And by 'we', we mean 'you'.

Dream TeaMI

The CIA has formed a group of highly skilled burner technologists that might just be the strongest brains trust for technologists in the country. If you're a specialist with an Asperger-esque way of digging into knowledge, perhaps you'd enjoy lifting your limitations in this group.

EVENT TIME

Community Tech Support (Special Agents)

During the event, these folks can be found floating around ops island looking lost and unkempt. They're just waiting for something to go wrong - hoping that an artwork won't power up, or that an led strip is going to fail, or that someone at this event will need their intimate knowledge of the structural changes a mechanical keyboard has undergone to reach its current form. They're our event tech support for the community, and they're fiercely anarchic and individual.



Power Rangers

Sometimes, the CIA has a person who's highly skilled at power and power generation. This person gets up in the evening and spends their nights fixing generators and car engines so that the spectacular shows can continue. Much like a Special Agent, the Power Ranger is also solo sand support.

The Iron Fist

This role is one of the worst roles on the event site - being the protector of the internet. You're the person everyone needs to get through to get an emergency call out of the desert. It's a thankless task, so we've all but closed the position. It only stays open because everyone's scared of the last Iron Fist.

Climbers / Riggers

If you're good at climbing or have very, very long arms and legs, we need people to climb up and down containers, masts, mountains, lampposts, toilets, artworks and much, much more. You get a free hard hat for the duration of the event.

BOX OFFICE

At the event

A shift in the Box Office takes you out of the desert elements for 4 hours and puts you into the hot seat at one of the Box Office windows, scanning the many burners arriving in the desert, into Tankwa Town. You'll need to be able to attend a Box Office briefing online before the event. You'll need to have a good understanding of computers and be able to confidently navigate the very simple back end features of the Quicket (our ticketing providers) system. We'll teach you how to use the system at the briefing. Preparing for your shift, you'll need to learn the different ticket types and their unique box office requirements. All this information will be sent to you in the Box Office Manual.

During your shift you'll need to have your wits about you, ensuring that you are putting the correct wrist band on, and linking the correct details to the wrist band and requesting any follow up information as pertains to the ticket they are checking in with. You may be put into the uncomfortable position of needing to deal with someone who's tickets won't get them access to the event, and you'll need to follow Box Office protocol to resolve it. You will always be supported by your shift lead in these scenarios.

Some shifts are extremely busy, and some are very quiet, so be prepared to work both eventualities. It's always fun working a Box Office shift, and we invite you to come be part of the Box Office furniture. You may even get a shirt out of it!

We have a camp at the event site, close to the entrance gate. If you're willing to commit to at least five shifts, you can camp with us. We're open to everyone, including families and solo travelers.

Airport Roles:

- 1. **Airspace Lead**: The go-to person for conflict resolution and advice. Look for the orange vest, airband radio, and Coms Radio.
- 2. **Airport Operations Lead**: Manages the airport, oversees volunteers, and aids passengers.
- 3. **Apron Marshallers**: Assist passengers at the airport gate, patrol the runway, and ensure safety.
- 4. **Passenger Marshal**: Directs Burners at the terminal and controls airfield access.
- 5. **Airport Wrangler**: Helps set up and take down airport infrastructure.

- 6. Airspace Camp Marshal: Assists campers with various tasks and communicates with the airport. Support available from Wednesday to Sunday.
- 7. Airport Runner: Fills gaps, collects passengers, and ensures radio batteries are fresh.

*Requirements: Vary per role, including online meetings, training, and experience.
